



## Principal's Message – Ms Doyle

Welcome back to our final term for 2024! Planning for 2025 is well and truly underway with enrolments being finalised, class structures determined, and staff being hired. We are planning to have two additional classes to start 2025. Mr Slavin will be taking his well-deserved year off in 2025 as part of the deferred salary scheme. I am currently running an internal process for existing Landsdale Gardens staff to apply to fill his position 0.8 (4 days) for twelve months. The remaining 0.2 (1 day) will provide the school flexibility to release staff to take on leadership roles. Not only will this be a fantastic opportunity for staff to gain experience in this role, but it will also be less disruptive for the school.

pavlova.






#### **Pen Pals**
