### Principal's Message – Natasha Doyle

As part of Strategic Priority 1 in the Business Plan, we have a focus of developing and embedding high impact teaching pedagogy theory and practice across the school. One part of this is a focus on reviewing information daily until it is grasped and stored in the longterm memory. We then push students beyond passive absorption of information, encouraging them to actively construct new knowledge by linking new concepts with what they already know, deepening their understanding and fostering a creative and critical thinking mindset.

At Landsdale Gardens, we have high impact teachers that have high expectations for all students. They work together to measure their impact and are clear with their students about the content and goals of their learning. We prioritise working collaboratively, professional learning and the development of a positive school culture. Staff have continued to work with Luke George to create statements of expectation for clarity of purpose, process, people, communication and reflection. These statements will support new staff to understand what is expected of them when they join Landsdale Gardens.

As I walk around the school each day, I am inspired by the Landsdale Gardens staff that work tenaciously and maintain high levels of energy, focus and enthusiasm in each of their roles. The first impression people make as they walk into the school is so important and we are blessed with Vanessa Pierre and Lisa Catchlove who make a huge difference in the front office, creating a positive culture at our school. Our staff are very good at what they do and are passionate about their work at the school.

Safety of our students is a priority, and it is disappointing to see some of our students not safely restrained in a car seat as they leave the school grounds or wearing helmets when they are riding home. Please remember that car seats are required by law according to the following rules;

- Aged 6 months to under 4 years are restrained in either a rear or forward-facing child restraint with in-built harness.
- Aged 4 years to under 7 years seated in either a forward-facing child seat or booster seat restrained by a fastened seatbelt or child safety harness.
- Children seven years and over can be restrained in an adult seatbelt or booster seats.

If a child is not wearing a seatbelt or a suitable child restraint as required by the law, then you risk being fined and incurring demerit points. You must not drive your vehicle with unrestrained children in it. Please remind your child that it is illegal to ride a bicycle without a helmet.

This Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> September is the last day for Term 3. I hope that you all have an enjoyable two- week vacation, spending valuable time together as a family. Term 4 resumes on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> October. For those of you that would like to plan a small getaway, we have a pupil free day on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October.
